DISASTER PREPAREDNESS



Beyond personal preparedness, effective communication may be the most critical element when a community faces a disaster. In recent years, we've experienced several incidents that rose to the level of emergency notifications, including wildfires, ice storms, and flooding.

As your Fire Chief, I ask you to take just a few minutes to create or review your account with Clackamas County Disaster Management's emergency notification system. This system ensures you can receive alerts by phone or email—no matter where you are—if your home or property is impacted by an emergency. Notifications may include evacuation orders or shelter-in-place instructions.
